

Attendance

This month's focus was on Attendance and our learners were asked, Is good attendance important? How can you improve your attendance? What would you do if you were to employ someone, and their attendance was poor? Here are some of their thoughts:

'It's a good way to measure and show what time you came in and how regularly...compared to the statutory amount.'

'Yes, it's important to have good attendance.' 'You need to come in more...' 'If you wake up early, get to school on time, your attendance will improve.'

and finally, 'I would sack them because I cannot trust them to be there when I need them.'

Attendance - Late arrivals... *Punctuality*

EMLM school day begins at 9.00 and the Learners are required to be in school by then. If a Learners arrives after the register has closed at 9.10, they will be marked as 'late.' Every Second Counts!

Safeguarding over the Christmas and New Year period

We have outlined some key issues which families/carers may face:

- Christmas can bring added financial strain, family pressures, or emotional stress
- Disruption of regular routine, which may leave our learners with more unstructured or unsupervised time. This could lead to situations where they spend more time in potentially unsafe environments, including online, or with individuals who may pose a risk to their safety
- Learners may also feel cut off from their usual support network of trusted adults and friends

Reduced access to support services - during the holidays, some support services, including schools or community organisations, might be closed or operating at reduced capacity.

Curriculum shout out... Design Technology

The National Curriculum describes Design and Technology as *'an inspiring, rigorous and practical subject.'* Here we look at a few of the key skills we would encourage our learners to develop and adopt through this subject:

Problem-Solving Skills: learning how to identify problems and finding creative solutions, adopting critical thinking and innovative practice.

Collaboration: project work involving teamwork, teaching our learners how to communicate effectively, share responsibility, and to collaborate towards a shared goal.

Adaptability: learning how to adapt to new challenges and technologies, whilst preparing them for the *'ever-evolving landscape of design and technology fields.'*

These sessions will not only equip our learners with technical knowledge and skills but also prepares them for challenges in the real world by adopting a mindset of constantly learning, improving and adapting.

Online Safety - Safeguarding over the Christmas and New Year period – What can you do to support your children?

- Encourage open discussions about how they need to safeguard themselves and provide information on available support services.
- Promote online safety -set up parental and safety settings on new devices, monitor online activity and be vigilant about your children's online activities, especially during the holidays when they may have more unsupervised time. Remind them about online safety and potential risks. The <u>Safer Internet</u> <u>Centre</u> has some excellent advice in their Parents' Guide to Technology and includes device-specific settings for different models.
- Continue to promote a culture of reporting concerns about child safety.
